I never give up and that’s why I’m different.”

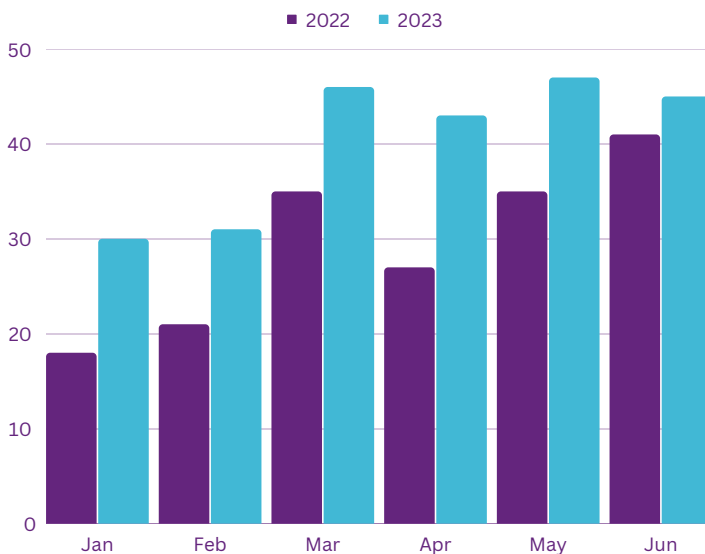
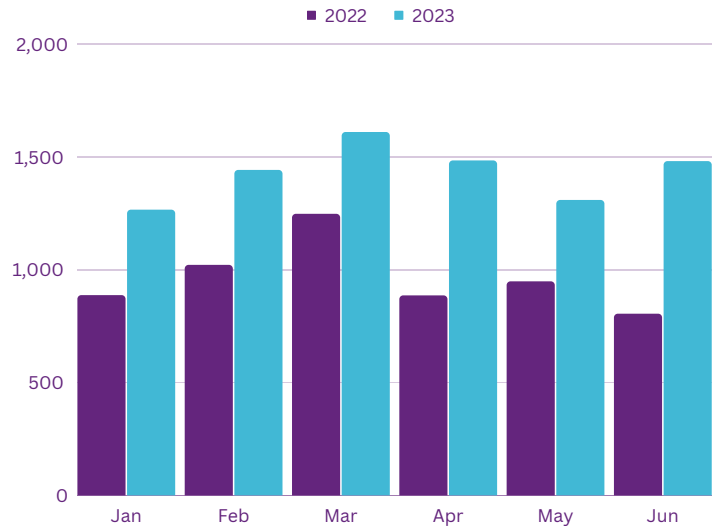

I suspected I had autism and had done a lot of research, so I wasn't surprised by the diagnosis, but it was really good to get the help."

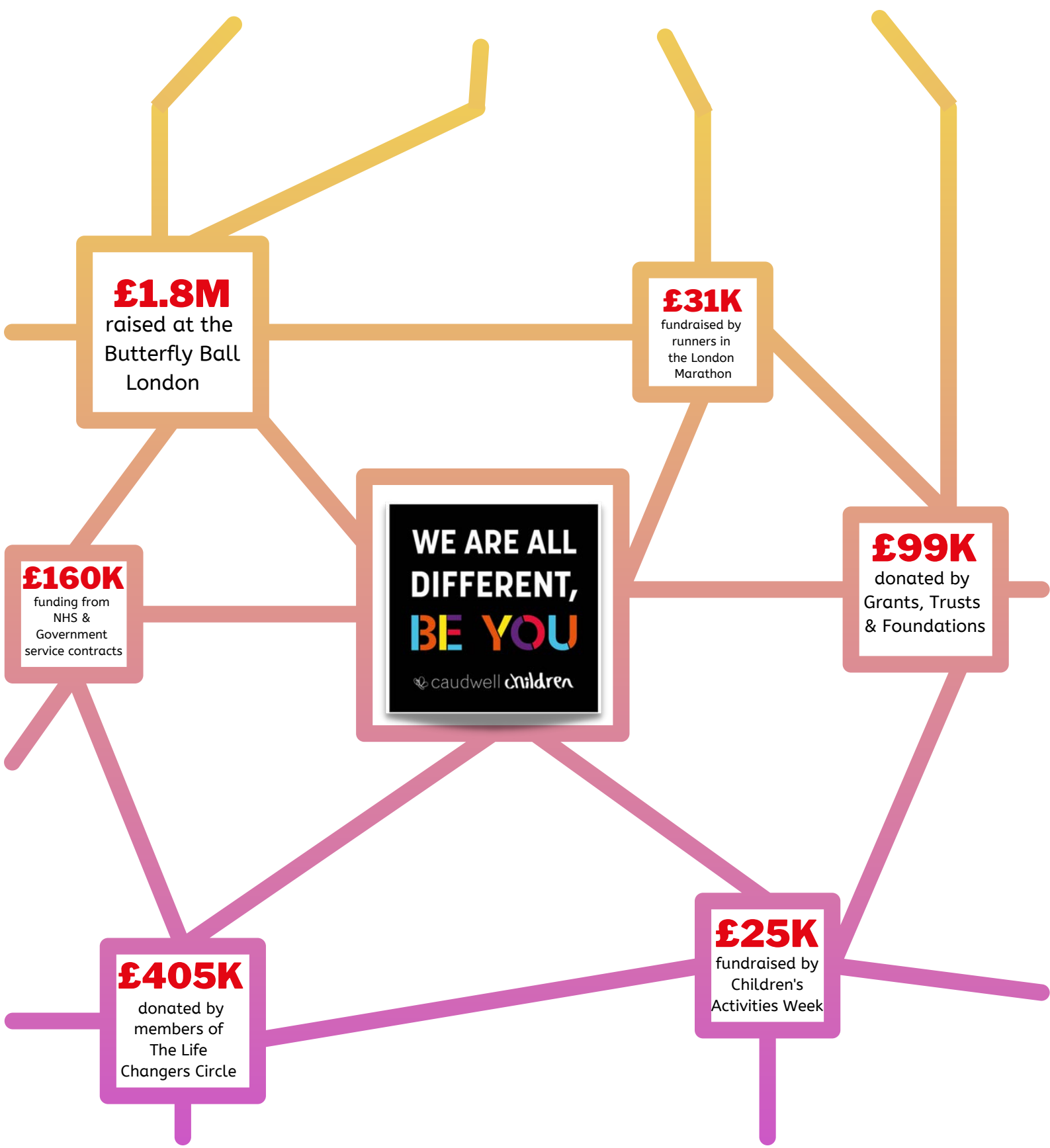
